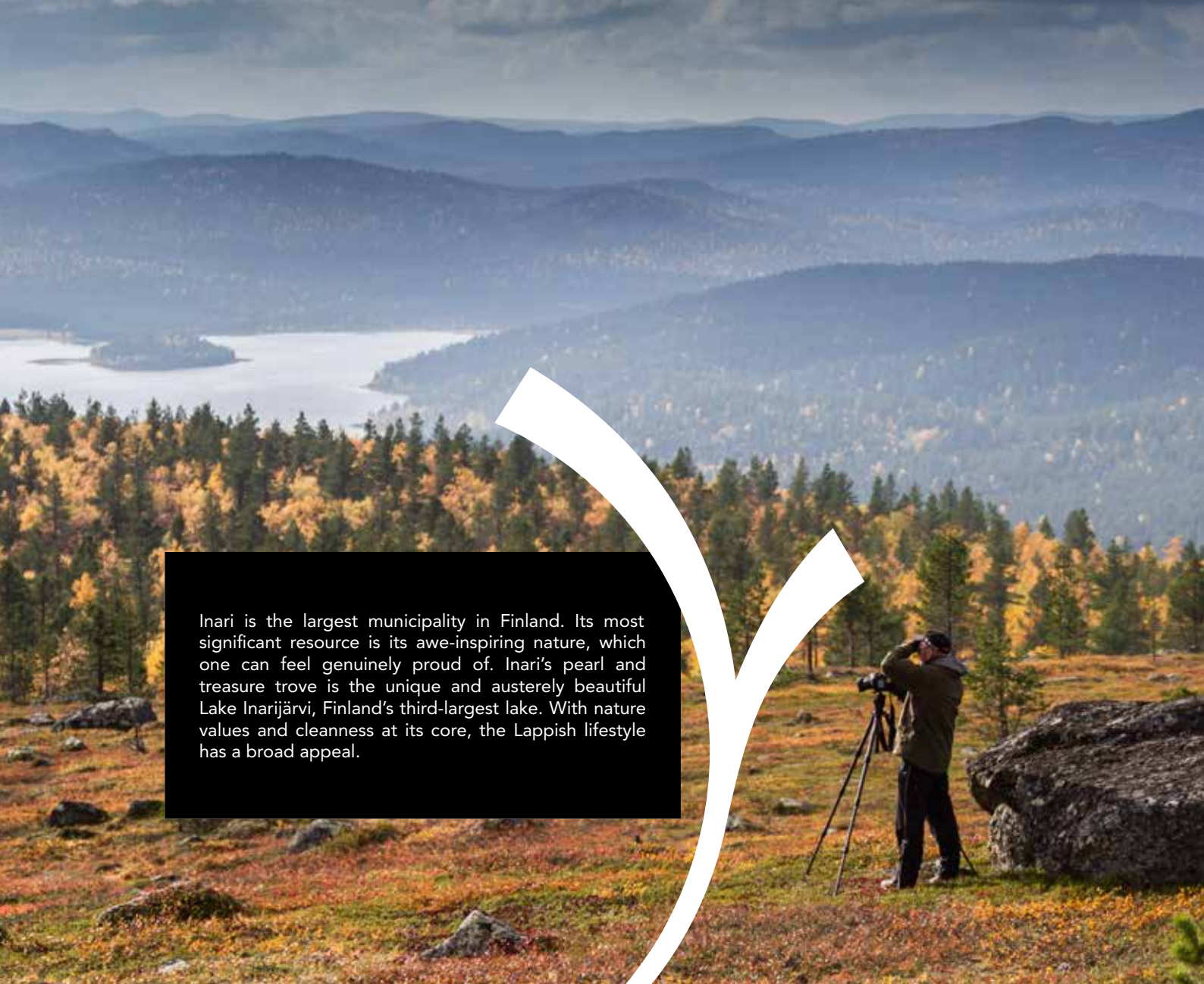

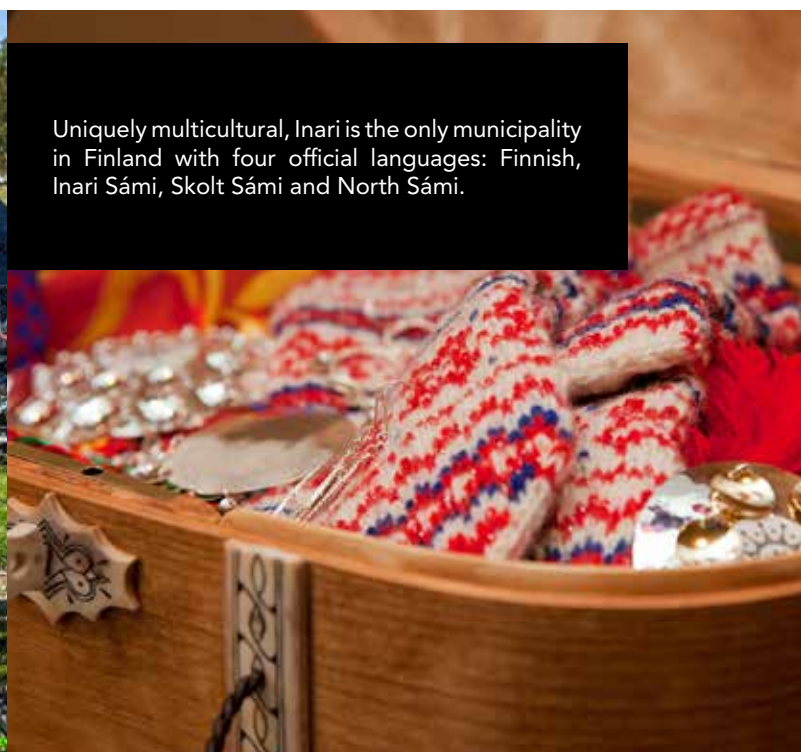

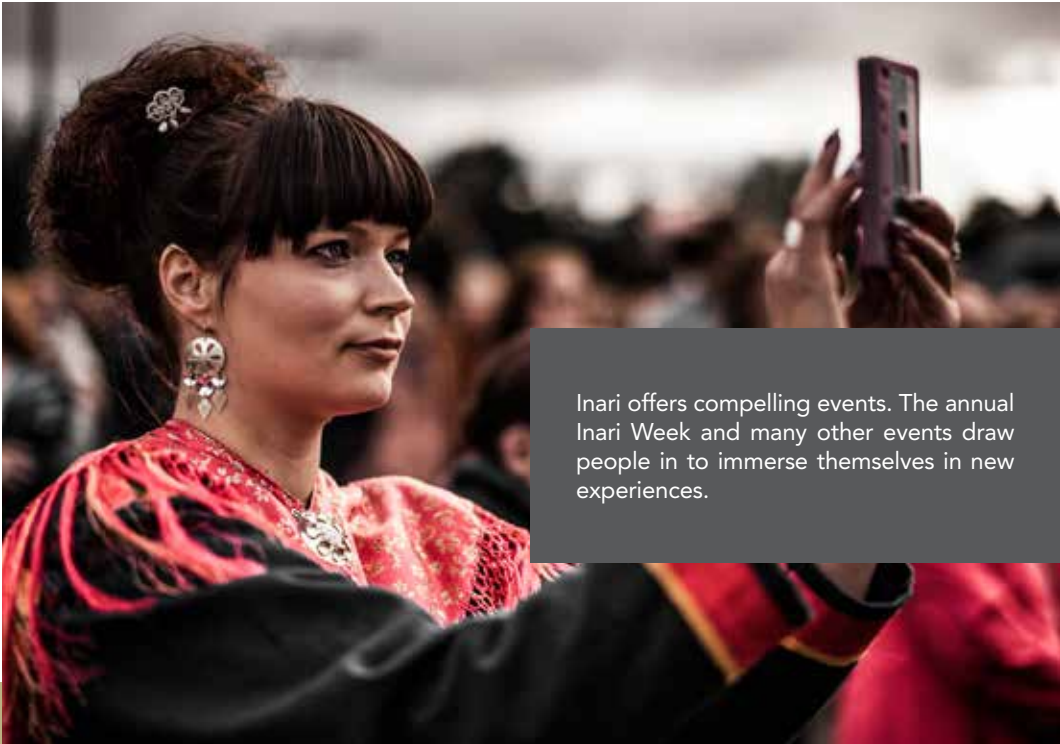

- Finland's largest municipality: total area 17,334 km<sup>2</sup>
- Protected areas: 10,948 km<sup>2</sup> (72.2% of the land area)
- Population: approximately 6,800
- Located in the northernmost corner of the European Union, in the middle of the Cap of the North
- Borders Norway and Russia
- Main industries: tourism, forestry, reindeer husbandry, fishing, education and cold technology, particularly automotive and tire testing
